



JEFFREY R. "JEFF" GANS INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Jeffrey R. "Jeff" Gans, from Voorhees, New Jersey, USA was elected to serve a two-year term as international director of Lions Clubs International at the association's 103rd International Convention, June 25 through June 29, 2021.

Director Gans has been an attorney since 1982 and is a frequent speaker for Continuing Legal Education.

He is a member of the Camden Lions Club—New Jersey's first Lions club—and has had perfect attendance since his father sponsored him in 1984. Coming from a multi-generational family of Lions, Director Gans fondly remembers attending his first Lions Clubs International Convention in 1961 as a five-year-old. He has held many offices within the association, including district governor, council treasurer, council chairperson, state & district parliamentarian, state & district rules chair, and state & district legal chair.

In recognition for his service, he has received numerous awards, including a Life Membership Award, a Grand Master Membership Key Award, an International President's Award, numerous International President's Certificates of Appreciation, an LCIF Helping Hands Award, a Club President Excellence Award, a 100% District Governor's Award, Club and District Lion of the Year Awards, and a MD16 Harold P. Nutter Distinguished Service Award. Director Gans is a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow Humanitarian Partner for having achieved the 100th Progressive Melvin Jones Level. He has also been recognized as a Brandel-Murphy Youth Foundation "Everyday Hero", a PIP Donald E. Banker Fellow, a PIP James T. Coffey Fellow, a PID Gene Polgar Fellow, a PID Cindy Gregg Kidsight Fellow, a William A. Smith Fellow, a Marshall Klein Knights for Vision Fellow, an Elspeth Moore Sight Conservation Fellow, and as a Melvin Jones Lions International Memorial Vanguard.

Director Gans is also a life member of the Lions Eye Bank of Delaware Valley, the Lions Eye Research Foundation of NJ, the Florida Lions Foundation for the Blind, the Diabetes Foundation, Inc (NJ), and the Lions International Stamp Club. He is also a longtime member of the Lions International Trading Pin Club.

In addition to his Lions activities, Director Gans is active in numerous civic and professional organizations including Bestwork Industries for the Blind Inc., where he has continually served as an officer or board member since 1984. He has also served as vice president and board member for Big Brothers Big Sisters of Camden and Gloucester Counties.

Director Gans and his wife, Ellyn, who is also a Lion and Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, have a daughter and a son who are also Progressive Melvin Jones Fellows.

I am still waiting to hear any news about how the new portal will work and will pass on any information I get as soon as I get some. One thing I have received is all members must be entered into My LCI with their own individual email address by June 15th. Family units that currently share an email will not be able to use the same email to access the new portal. Also, you will no longer be able to use a phone number to access the new portal.

We have talked a lot about partnering with another organization to do a service project in your area.

When you participate in advocacy by using your voice, you are creating service opportunities through community awareness, education, legislation and public policy and partnerships with others. Remember quality service projects increase member satisfaction and help attract new members who are looking to serve. Make use of your social media to show what you are doing and what you have done so more people are aware of the impact you are making in your communities.

Remember, there are a wide variety of grants available to help Lions serve their local communities and the world. LIONS AND THE DIABETES CHALLENGE

What can we do?

Type 2 Diabetes Screening

Did you know that type 2 diabetes accounts for 90% of all diabetes cases worldwide? In fact, approximately 374 million people are at risk of developing diabetes. Lions can help reduce these numbers by organizing type 2 diabetes screening events in their communities.

Type 2 diabetes screening is an important way to help individuals understand their risk while also making the community healthier. In the short term, screenings help community members learn about diabetes and understand their current health status. If necessary, they can also be referred for care. All of this leads to an overall improved quality of life.

A type 2 diabetes screening event provides community members with type 2 diabetes education, awareness, including referral services. **Lions** clubs work with medical professionals and other community partners to determine screening methods and any necessary equipment.

LCI has provided a helpful project planner to guide every step of your screening event, from outlining tasks and finding volunteers to determining budgets and measuring impact. You can use all or parts of the planning guide, whichever fits your club's screening goals.

Strides for Diabetes Awareness

Strides activities are a fun and engaging way for Lions and Leos everywhere to promote diabetes awareness and help their community members prevent or delay the onset of type 2 diabetes.

A Strides event can be any physical activity, from a 5-mile run to a dance competition, volleyball game or bike riding obstacle course. Get creative with Strides and use positivity and exercise to open the door to

diabetes awareness and promote the importance of regular physical activity in the management of type 1 and type 2 diabetes.

LCI has also provided a Strides Planning Kit, containing important resources, customizable templates, the Strides bookmark and stickers to personalize your Strides materials. This worthwhile event can also be lots of fun!

Pediatric Cancer

Pediatric Cataract is most prevalent in Asia especially in the rural areas but it is a global problem and can lead to blindness. An estimated 1.4 million children are blind in the world but pediatric cataract can be prevented or treated. Early detection and follow up is very important. Bausch + Lomb partnered with Lions Club International Foundation to form the Pediatric Cataract Initiative to provide early detection, early prevention followed by appropriate follow up care.

This Initiative awarded a \$150,000 grant to the Siliguri Lions Eye Hospital in India. The grant enabled the hospital to provide public education and screenings to 150,000 children, purchase state of the art equipment, and provided staff with the advanced training to diagnose and treat pediatric cataracts.

Lions work with the hospital to provide transportation, counseling, comprehensive eye exams, surgeries and follow up care.




