All other requirements will remain. SVDG training will begin this upcoming summer. We are looking forward to continuing our travels and to the experiences we will have.

Dear Lions and Leos,

Preparation is underway to begin rolling out the new Lion Portal. Here is some important information to prepare you for launch.

Phased rollout for Lion Account Users

Our target launch window is April 15 – May 13*. During this time, all current Lion Account users will receive an email inviting them to access the new Lion Portal**. We're doing this phased rollout to ensure staff are available to provide the best support possible and offer you a positive introductory experience.

- Now April 11: MyLion, MyLCI and Insights will continue to function as normal.
- April 12 and beyond: MyLion, MyLCl and Insights are no longer available.
- April 15 May 13: Invitations to access the new Lion Portal sent via email on a rolling basis to existing Lion Account users.
 - Please note: User permissions will not change. In other words, those who can report service, access member data and other key functions remains the same.
- May 13 and beyond: All visitors attempting to access the previous digital tools will be automatically redirected to the new Lion Portal.

*Dates are subject to change. Our number one goal is to create a positive experience for Lions and Leos. If determined more time is required to ensure the product is in an optimal state, the dates may be adjusted accordingly.

**If you don't see the email in your everyday inbox, please check all spam and junk folders for it first before contacting Member Support.

Note that the new Lion Portal will require a unique, unshared email, and phone numbers will no longer be supported as a log in credential.

Dear Lions, Lioness Lions, and Leos,

Do you or does your household waste food? Here are some frequently asked questions about food waste in America.

What is the history of food waste in America?

Food waste dates back to the late 19th century and early 20th century when rapid urbanization and industrialization changed how food was produced, distributed, and consumed. Post-World War II, the advent of processed foods and a culture of abundance led to increased waste. By the late 20th and early 21st centuries, awareness about food waste grew, but so did the levels of waste due to consumer habits and inefficiencies in the food supply chain.

Why does America waste so much food?

Food is wasted due to a combination of factors, including consumer behavior (like over-purchasing and discarding foods based on cosmetic standards), inefficiencies in the food supply chain, lack of awareness about food preservation, and confusing food date labeling. Additionally, the culture of abundance and large portion sizes in food service contributes to this issue.

What is the average food waste per household in America?

Each household wastes about 32% of its food, equating to around \$1,866 worth of food annually. This includes food discarded due to spoilage, over-purchasing, and uneaten leftovers.

How much food is wasted in America every day?

Approximately 150,000 tons of food are wasted every day.

How much food does America waste per year?

An estimated 133 billion pounds of food are wasted annually. This is 30-40% of the entire US food supply, equating to a monetary value of about \$161 billion.

What are the most wasted foods in America?

Milk, Bread, Potatoes, Cheese, Apples, Lettuce, Avocados, Chicken, and Bananas.



Grant Request Guidelines:

All Grant Applications meeting the following guidelines will be reviewed at the next Lions Youth Services Meeting. Our meetings are held at 6:30 pm on the 2nd Thursday of every month at the Airport Diner in Manchester. We encourage all clubs to join us to present their request.

- All requests submitted by the President of a Lions Club in the State of New Hampshire Districts 44N and/or 44H
- The Maximum Grant is \$500. LYS will consider up to 2 requests per NH Lions Club per Lions year (July-June)
- Each application must be for a unique project. Applications for the same project within the same Lions Year will not be considered.
- Each application should benefit more than one individual. Applications benefitting one person will not be considered.
- Grant Applications <u>MUST</u> be mailed to LYS, PO Box 156, Atkinson, NH 03811 by the last day of the month *prior* to the start of the project, otherwise the request may not be considered.






The Bedford Lions want to thank the Merrimack club for volunteering and attending the event!
