#### **Environmental Committee January 2023**



The Environmental Committee is excited to share our refined mission! We are committed to assisting clubs across the state of New Hampshire in implementing their choice of "prepackaged" environmentally focused projects. We are thrilled that the Henniker Lions Club has enthusiastically agreed to be our test club. We will start by initiating two projects: a Do-It-Yourself sustainable gift-making fair before Mother's Day and the construction and distribution

of raised vegetable garden beds to community members: later this summer, Lions will construct and distribute 3'x4' raised beds complete with bagged soil, frost-hardy salad seeds, and mini hoop houses. This project will be marketed to low-income families 2 weeks prior to the general public, and will include an ongoing educational component.

These projects will yield numerous benefits on community, environmental, and club levels, fostering learning opportunities for both adults and children about enjoyable, simple ways to alter habits and reduce carbon footprints. While video games and social media can be entertaining, the satisfaction of creating or growing something will always surpass virtual experiences. Rather than driving and purchasing a packaged gift from a store, you can create a unique custom masterpiece. Instead of buying vegetables shipped hundreds of miles from factory farms with nutrient-depleted soil, you can step into your yard and harvest a fresh salads and vegetables from April through December. The projects also target several Lion's causes including the Environment, Youth, Health, and Hunger, while addressing the social economic disparity in the impact of climate change.

An environmental focus can work wonders for attracting new members to your club! Thanks largely to new members' interest in environmental issues and their eagerness to contribute, Henniker gained 12 new members last year and 5 this year, with another 2 eagerly anticipating joining. The Environmental Committee also helped welcomed a new member to the Granite State Virtual Lions Club.

The Environmental Committee is continuing to spread the NH Lion's Zero-Waste Club Initiative. If your club is interested in participating, we are more than willing to assist in planning your next event. Incorporating reusable and compostable materials is simpler than you might think!


#### The Enfield-Mascoma Lioness Club
