

How does it work?

At the end of June 2024, we will take the total number of service hours reported to Lions International for each club. That number will be divided by the number of members in the club at year end to determine the average number of service hours per member for the year.

Example:

Club A has reported 1500 hours of service at the end of June.

They have 20 members on their roster.

1500/20=75 hours per year per member.

From International Director Steve Middlemiss

LeeAnn and I have returned from an amazing 2 weeks attending the Board meeting in Cairo and various service projects in Kenya. We were able to accomplish a lot at our Board meetings which built on the work of the Directors who came before us. While the Directors were in meetings, the companions completed service projects in Cairo, including cleaning the Nile River and planting trees.

What was most important to LeeAnn and I were the service projects we were able to be a part of in Kenya. We assisted the Lions Sight First Hospital where we screened school children for new eyeglasses. Most of the children who needed glasses left that day with new ones due to the amazing work of the Kenyan Lions who support the Hospital. We also helped distribute food to 50 families from a Maasai village.

We planted trees to help start the new Nashuali Lions Forest which will hopefully yield more trees to sustain the members of the local villages who use the wood to build their huts and for cooking fires. Additionally, we donated 2 solar cookers to the families of a local village, a project started by the Lions of Finland. These cookers are important tools to the women and children of the village. The women currently cook using wood fires, however, they do so inside their huts which is not a healthy choice and the children often lose valuable school time searching for firewood. The solar cookers are \$120 each and if you or your club are interested in purchasing one, just let me know and I will connect you to the appropriate person. It's a great way to broaden our service.

It is amazing to see the impact we can have on people's lives throughout the world. This trip really drove home the importance that we are truly a worldwide organization.

We continue to look forward to serving the Lions of NH and the World as we all work toward "Changing the World".

Genetics or Behavior

Many people know that genetics play a role in eye conditions. Recent research has begun to show that behavior has a bigger role in the development of myopia (nearsightedness) than previously assumed. When children from a very early age focus on things close at had without balancing that activity with looking to the distance, the eyes are encouraged to change in size to accommodate near-vision over far-vision. The more near-vision is favored over far-vision, the greater the impact. So, screen time is fine if there is equal outdoor activity where the horizon is the limit, so to speak. Even adults can benefit from taking a 10 minute break hourly to gaze off into the distance to refresh their eyes. Genetics may play a part, but it is not the only determinant of our eye health!





Club Highlights

Manchester Lions

Thank you NH Lions Youth Services for funding of the Manchester Lion's grant for the Manchester Boys and Girls Club. The Manchester Boys and Girls Club was extremely appreciative of the funding.



Hillsboro Lions

Club completed 145 vision screenings at Hillsboro-Deering and Washington schools. Twenty students were referred for further evaluation. Five Lions and one non-Lion participated in the event totaling 30 hours.

The Club received a check in the amount of \$8200 for our involvement in the Hillsboro SummerFest program. Eight Lions participated in the event totaling 141 volunteer hours.

Antrim-Bennington Lions

We have had an exciting month!


