#### HUNGER

Nationwide nearly 30 million children participate in the US Department of Agriculture's (USDA) school breakfast and lunch programs during the school year. However, when schools are closed, kids lose access to these healthy meals and are at higher risk of food and nutrition insecurity.

The NH Food Bank supports the USDA's Summer Nutrition Program for Kids (SUN Program), a federally funded, state administered program which provides kids and teens with access to tasty nutritious meals during the summer months. This program distributes breakfast and lunch to kids at safe, supervised, accessible sites such as libraries and schools.

The NH Food Bank also supports and administers summer nutrition programs in areas of the state that may lack the financial and administrative capacity to provide summer meals and has historically had a specific focus on ensuring Coös, Carroll, and Grafton Counties and the Keene area have the resources they need to serve meals to children during the summer. The NH Food Bank works closely with the NH Department of Education to meet the USDA's Food and Nutrition Services guidelines.

Finished our successful annual Lucky Duck Race by washing and counting the ducks to be prepared for next year. Winners have been contacted and most prizes have been received.


We have ordered a new vision screener and are looking forward to resuming our screening program in area schools and other venues.
